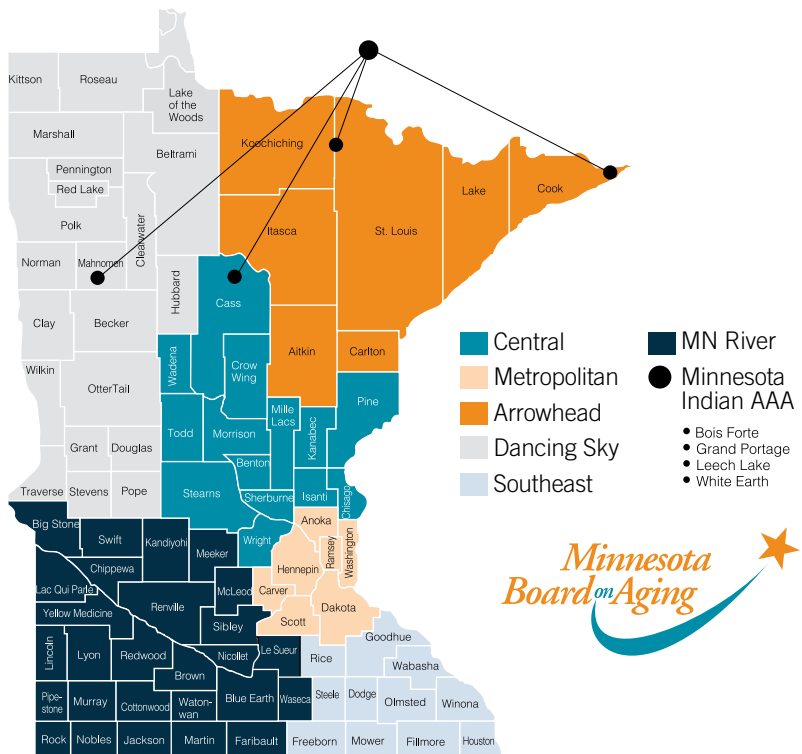

2012 Minnesota Older Americans Act Profile



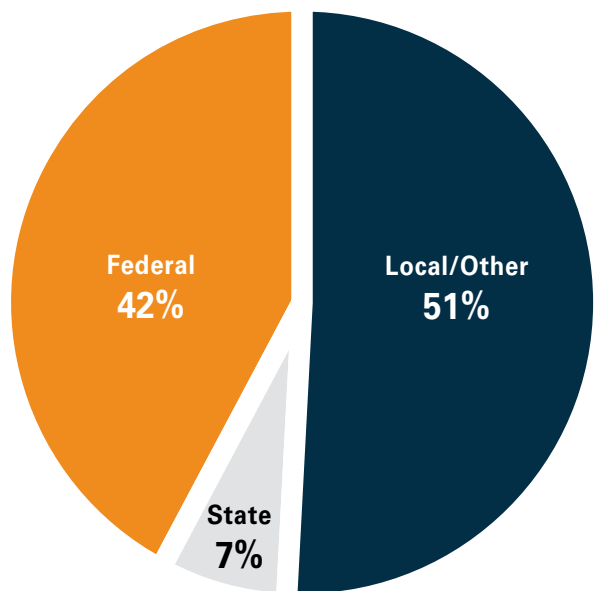
The Minnesota Board on Aging is the federally designated State Unit on Aging for Minnesota. In that role, it has primary responsibility for administering Older Americans Act funding and programs for Minnesota's 963,000 citizens age 60 and older. The Board also works with Lieutenant Governor Yvonne Prettner Solon and has implemented the One Stop Shop for Minnesota Seniors on her behalf. Each year, the Minnesota Board on Aging provides a comprehensive report of the services provided through the federal Older Americans Act and State of Minnesota funding to the federal Administration for Community Living. 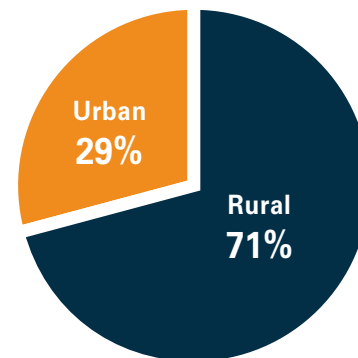
CONSUMERS LIVING ALONE

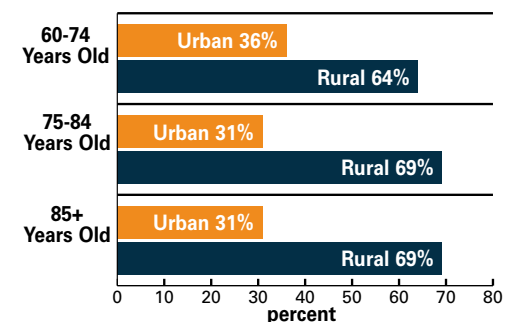


WHERE CONSUMERS LIVE

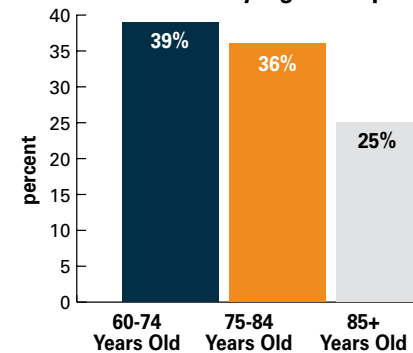
71% of Older Americans Act consumers live in rural Minnesota.
